

JENNI REUTER

Architect, Associate Professor in Architectural Principles and Theory Aalto University, Finland Jenni Reuter explores the evolving role of architects, new pedagogical models, and the intersection of architecture with other art disciplines. Since 2016, she has curated the Architecture Speaks! lecture series with the Museum of Finnish Architecture.

As a practicing architect, Reuter collaborates with Saija Hollmén and Helena Sandman. Their notable projects include designing dormitories for girls in Tanzania and the Women's Centre in Senegal.

In 2007, they founded Ukumbi NGO to provide architectural services to underprivileged communities. Their work has received national and international recognition, been widely published and exhibited, including at the Venice Architecture Biennale. Reuter is also active in academia and holds several positions of trust, contributing to juries worldwide.
